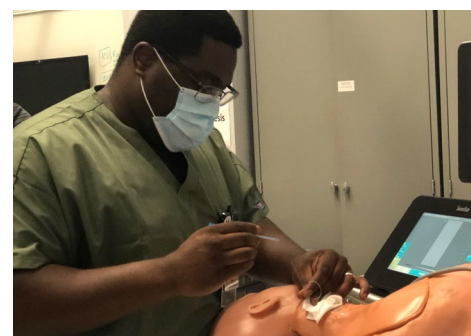
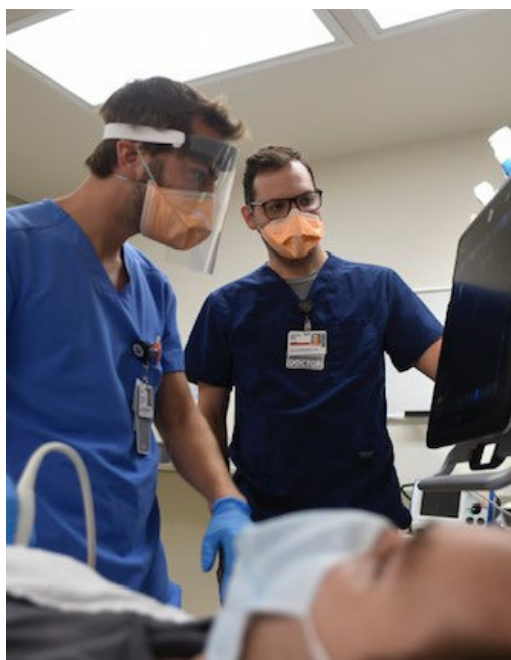
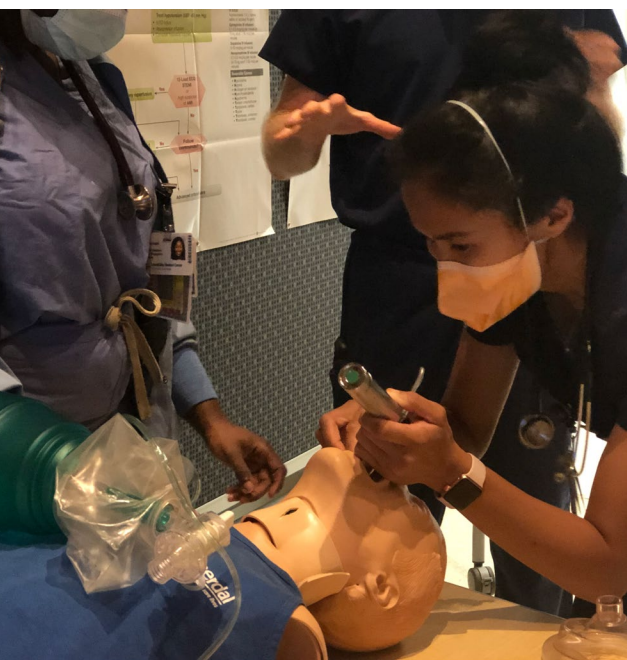
# About the Program

## Highlights

- Provide a cohesive, longitudinal three years program of robust training in the field of emergency medicine which ensures that residents acquire the skills necessary to care for a variety of patients.
- Provide opportunities for residents and faculty to engage in scholarly activity and teaching experiences with medical students and other trainees, in order to instill life-long learning in the field of emergency medicine.
- As a developing residency, residents will have impact on future of the residency and their training trajectory.
- Engagement with other specialty peers in multidisciplinary approach to learning to reduce specialty silos.

## Overview

The Emergency Medicine Residency is a 3-year program with 8 residents per year, for a total complement of 24. The program received accreditation from the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) in April, 2020.

- Smith Mountain Lake offers boating, paddle boarding, jet skiing, and many other water activities



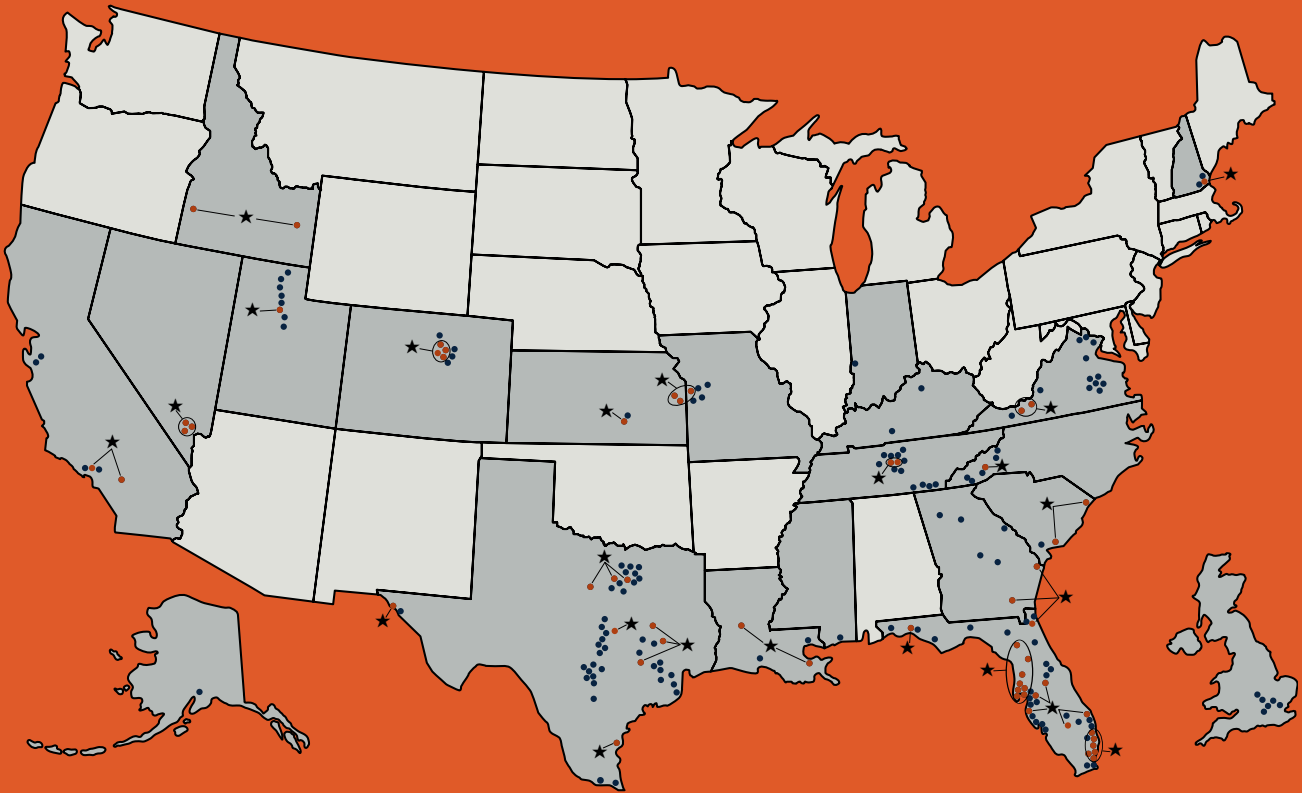

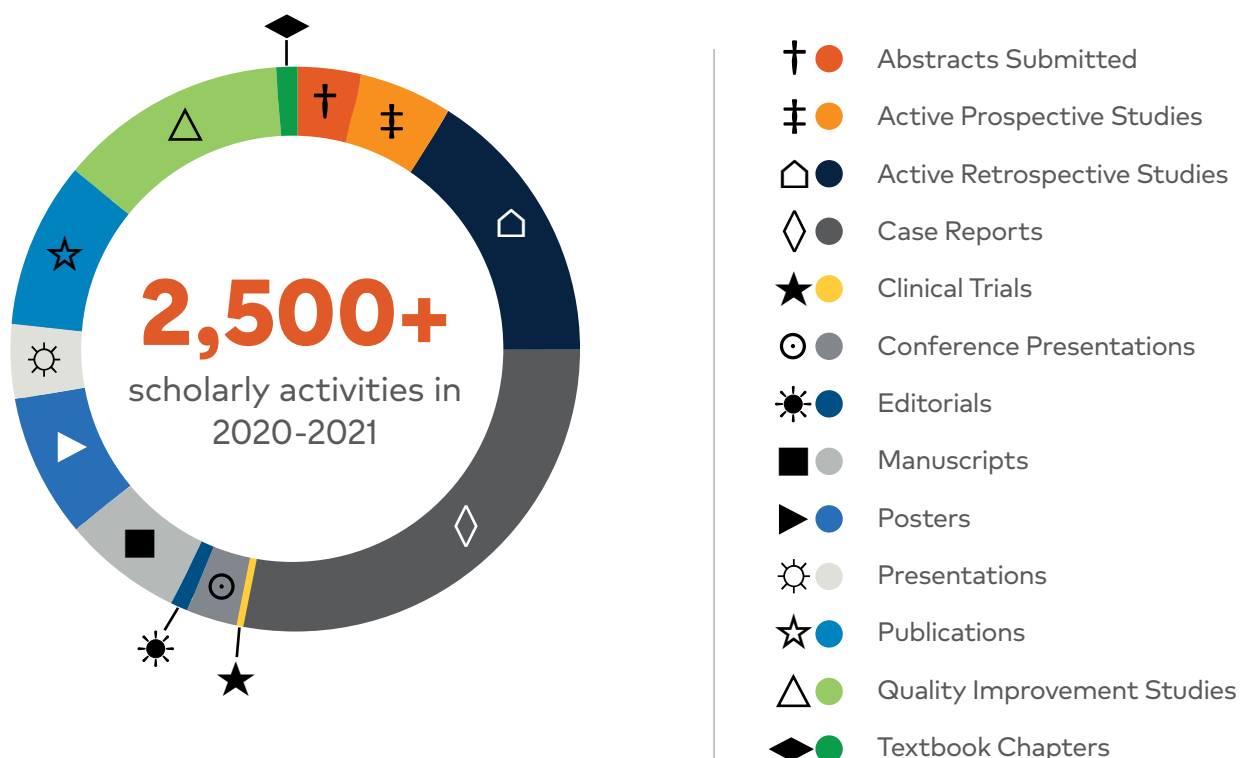

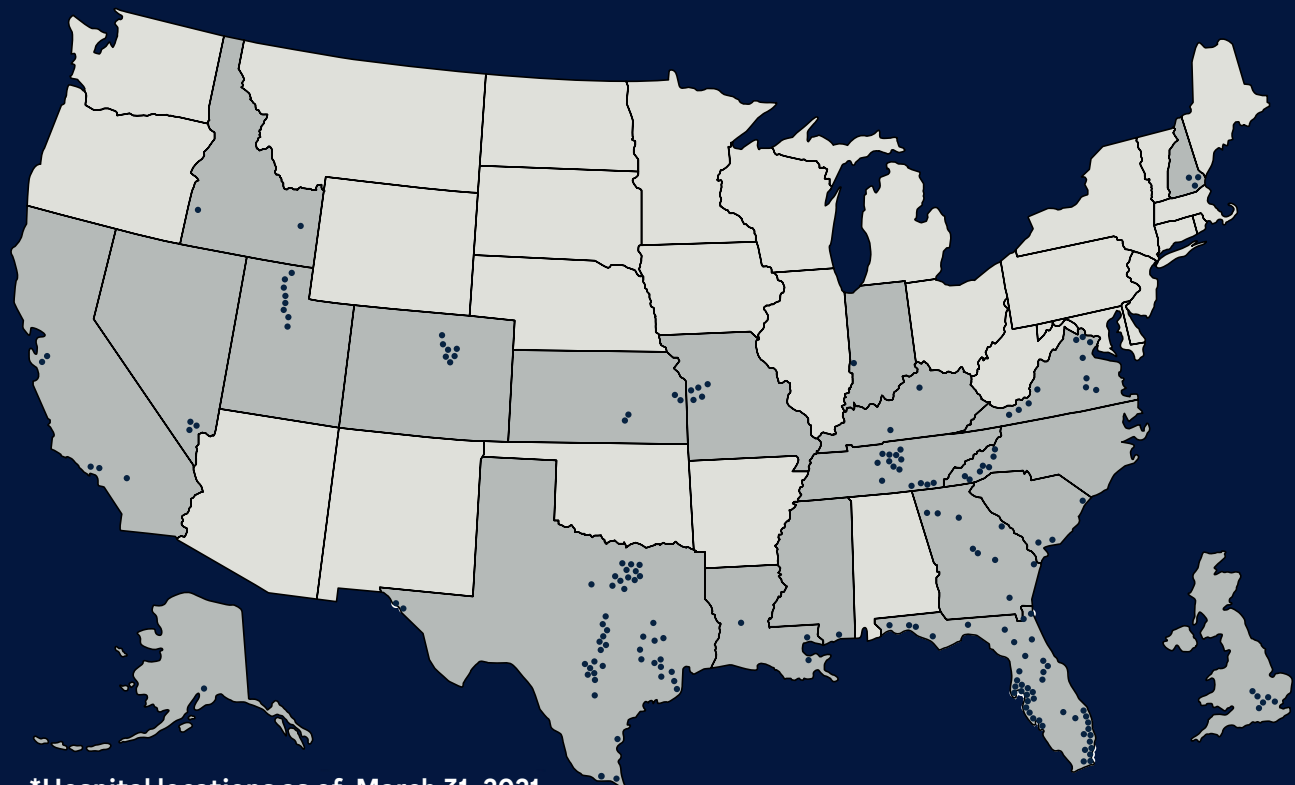
